
I hope you enjoy reading the enclosed publication and I look forward to sharing progress updates with you. It's an exciting time for History San José and I am very proud to be leading such

In the FY 2022-2023 we hit a big milestone for membership--maintaining over 200 members for the first time since the pandemic. This was attributed to a membership acquisition campaign we ran from May through July. Through this campaign, we gained 63 members! We also saw the largest group of friends and family join us at History Park during our Red, White, and Blue Member's Picnic with over 200 people. In addition to the dazzling firework show courtesy of the San Jose Giants, families enjoyed free crafts, walking tours of the park, ice cream, and a glass blowing demonstration from the Bay Area Glass Institute. The event also was the debut of our self-guided walking tour.

## **Collection Center**

History San José's Collections and Exhibitions Team, which includes Research Library and Archives, curates and cares for the over 130,000 pieces in its collection, most housed in the 45,000+ sq ft warehouse located across from History Park. This year, we accepted over 40 new donations, including materials from the former Western Appliance store on West San Carlos Street.

Did you know... you can experience over 82,000 items from History San Jose's collection online? These include 100+ KNTV news films from the 60's recently added through the California Revealed program.

### **Collection Highlight: Lu Ryden Collection**



Lu Ryden hosted two shows on KNTV in the 1960s aimed at an audience that was underserved at the time: housewives like her. Many of these long-lost interviews were donated to HSJ by Ryden's son, and are available online

at the Internet Archive, including her interview with comedian Flip Wilson at Bimbo's 365 nightclub.

# **Special Events & Rentals**

## **Education**

In the fiscal year 2022-2023, the Special Events Department achieved a significant milestone, marking the largest year of events in the post-Covid era. We generated additional income and improved visitor experience through the revival of G&A's Gift Shop and Information Center and the launch of the HSJ Parking Team. Going forward, G&A will continue to be open on weekends and for special events.



History Park played host to over 50 events, drawing in nearly 100,000 visitors. The most attended events were cultural celebrations, car shows, and maker's fairs. We saw an increase in local companies and non-profits utilizing History Park for staff retreats, meetings, and fundraisers.

History San José affiliates played a pivotal role, contributing to these numbers by organizing 25 different educational and cultural events at History Park.







History San José sparks curiosity and fosters cultural understanding through immersive field trips for thousands of young learners and educators annually. In the 2022-2023 school year, our Education Team engaged 8,158 in-person and 369 virtual participants in one of our 10 available programs.

Our Title I School Fund, launched in 2020, offers neighboring Title I schools these interactive learning opportunities and reimburses schools \$300 for transportation costs. In the 2022-2023 school year, we had over 1,200 participants, which accounted for 14% of the total number of school participants.

### Do You Know the Way to San José?

In Spring 2022 HSJ partnered with Quimby Oak Middle School's Lobo School of Innovation for an exciting project: "Do You Know the Way to San Jose?" This year's program invited students to research, formulate, and design interpretive projects to be displayed throughout History Park, offering visitors valuable insights into the city's past.

With the secured funds from the City of San José, HSJ and LSI turned two of the projects into full-size art installations. Local artist Ramon Franco brought the students' visions to life and the installation will live at History Park for at least two years, periodically traveling to other local sites.

# **Public Programs**

## **Volunteers**

History San José defines public programs as events, workshops, or happenings that are directly ticketed by HSJ with a level of cultural or educational focus.



This fiscal year included the introduction of several new public programs including a Sketchwalk program through the Carmela and Thomas Fallon house with San Jose Artist ambassador Suhita Shirodkar, the women's history "Celebrating Heritage, Community, and HERstories" event, the Spring Eggstravaganza, and a spring tea to highlight affiliate organizations.

The women's history event, in collaboration with Mosaic America, provided a space to enjoy lightning book talks and cultural performances throughout the park, while the Spring Eggstravaganza brought a highly sought egg hunt to the valley. At least 11,000 people visited History Park this year (excluding event rentals) and enjoyed our facilities





### **Volunteers**

History San José would not be the organization it is today without the support of dedicated volunteers. This past year, volunteers logged over 8,136 donated hours!

This year, six new weekend docents were recruited and trained as well as one new gardener and three special event volunteers. Two new special volunteer roles were filled: office information desk volunteer and summer research volunteer.

### **Partnerships**

In addition to History San José volunteers, we have continued our partnership with the National Charity League, Willow Rose chapter. These volunteers help run our crafts and games at all of our special events like Spirit of '45, Antique Autos, San José Roots, and holiday events.

New partnerships this year include the Kiwanis Club of San Jose who used their connections with local key clubs to provide volunteer work days with students from Yerba Buena High School and Oak Grove High School.
